Luyi's Curriculum Corner

Dear Parents,

Summer break is just around the corner. I hope you are looking forward to a relaxing and joyful time.

We realized that young people experience learning losses when they are not in school during the summer, and therefore would like to encourage them to engage in activities to help them stay connected with language learning. Every student in Kindergarten through 3rd grade will bring home a Chinese CD containing songs, stories, and poems for them to enjoy. I would like to recommend that the students listen to the CD for 10 to 15 minutes every day - you could play the CD in the car when driving to summer camps, listen to it during lunch or before bed time. The purpose of the CD is for students to maintain their familiarity with the Chinese language.

Students in grades 1 through 7 will have assignments in both Chinese and English. We will send home the English packet before the last day of school and post the Chinese assignments on the Summer Homework Page by June 9 (password: 2014summer). The Chinese assignments will include age-appropriate books/ articles and movies for students to read and watch. For each movie or reading selection, we ask the student to complete a simple summary page. These assignments will count towards students' grades in the fall.

Lastly, we will have weekly math challenge questions for all the grade levels. If the students choose to complete and submit their answers to school via email or by mail on or before August 1, they will receive feedback and be entered into a drawing for a surprise. You will find the information on the Summer Homework Page as well.

I hope our summer assignment plans will add fun and variety to your family's activities, and help your student maintain their academic skills. As always, please let me know if I can help answer any questions.
