We will communicate with you via Power School, the website, Facebook, and WCCO in a timely manner.

Finally, if we have school, we will leave the decision as to whether or not your child will attend up to you. We will count the absence as excused should you decide to keep your child home for safety's sake. Once the children are in school, they will be safe and warm; even though we wouldn't plan to go outside, complete winter gear is critical. As an added precaution on our end, Mr. Brewer has renewed our emergency plan with the armory across the park should we need to evacuate the building. Together let us take every precaution.

Excitement for Chinese New Year is in the air! We look forward to sharing the talents of our students with you next Friday evening at 6:00PM at Benson Great Hall on the campus of Bethel University. Tickets are a hot commodity, according to YACA Cultural Chair Wynee Igel!

Luyi's Curriculum Corner

Dear Yinghua Families,

Warm greetings to all Yinghua families and friends! Happy Chinese New Year!

Chinese New Year is a time for family get-togethers. It is also a time to pass on important family traditions and stories. At Yinghua, we have come together and formed a new family where we celebrate the Chinese New Year in a special way that makes all of us joyful.

In Chinese-speaking regions, starting in the middle of the twelfth month on the lunar calendar, families begin preparing for the New Year, creating an atmosphere of joy and renewal. Families spend a great deal of time cleaning the whole house to remove the old and welcome the new. At Yinghua, we have discussed the meaning of this practice and designated a time on Wednesday, January 29 for this activity and prepare the whole school for a new beginning.

Traditionally, families also hang red paper couplets on panels of exterior doors. At Yinghua, the main office area and classrooms will be decorated with festive objects, many of them made by teachers and students.

On New Year's Eve, which falls on January 30 this year, the whole family gathers together to have a sumptuous dinner. At the end of the meal, parents and elders hand out New Year money (red envelopes) to children and wish them luck, health and good grades (of course). At Yinghua, the students and staff will have a light dinner together on January 31 at Bethel University before the performance. The red envelopes (filled with gold chocolate coins) will be handed out to students on New Year's Eve, January 30.

The Chinese people value prosperity and good luck, so anything that can help bring these elements into the celebration is important. On February 4, we will have a special dumpling treat for all the staff and students. The shape of the dumplings resembles old Chinese gold ingots so eating lots of them during the New Year brings good fortune. On February 5, we will pass out apples and oranges to our students. Their peace and luck sounding names in Chinese ("ping and ji") make them the perfect symbols for the New Year.

During the Chinese New Year, people typically wear new clothes from head to toe to hope for a fresh start in the New Year. People often visit friends and relatives to wish them a Happy New Year. At Yinghua, students learned cultural programs to perform for the parent community; they also learned many auspicious phrases which will be incorporated throughout the performance. I hope you will be able to come to the performance on Friday, January 31 at Bethel University and ring in the Year of the Horse with us!

Spelling Bee




Stay warm this weekend!
