# Luyi's Curriculum Corner

Dear Yinghua families,

I am thrilled to share some good news with you. We were notified by STARTALK last week that we have been awarded a grant to offer a summer camp specifically designed for our Middle School students. Please mark your calendars (July 21 to August 15) for this great opportunity. For families who are not familiar with STARTALK, it is the newest of the component programs of the National Security Language Initiative (NSLI) announced by former President Bush in January of 2006. The initiative seeks to expand and improve the teaching and learning of strategically important world languages that are not now widely taught in the US. # Chinese Language, Leadership, and Technology for Middle School Students

Intended for current (and former) Yinghua students in grades 6 through 10, this camp is designed to help students continue learning Chinese language and literature, engage students with technology and leadership and character development, and motivate them to become role models and assist younger learners with Chinese language learning. For weeks 1 and 2 (July 21 to August 1) of the camp, students will take a language course on site in the morning, and receive leadership training in the afternoon. The language course, developed by Dr. Luyi Lien and Yinghua Middle School teachers and tailored to Yinghua students, will be delivered online in partnership with Minnesota Online High School and enable students to earn high school credit. For weeks 3 and 4 (August 4 to August 15), the students will continue with the language course and complete their service learning component by working alongside language coaches in the summer camp for students in grades K through 5.

<u>Dates</u>: July 21 to August 15, Monday through Friday, 8:30AM to 4:00PM <u>Instructors</u>: The Chinese class instructors will be Lu Yang laoshi, Bo Liu laoshi, and Mrs. Pamella Stommes. The leadership training will be provided by Ms. Sarah Totall and Ms. Erin Thune, with Chinese language coaches available to support leadership vocabulary development in Chinese.

Cost: \$500.00 (refundable upon completion of the camp)

Capacity: Maximum 20 students

Registration period: March 3 to May 3, 2014, or until filled (Registration

form will be available in next week's newsletter)

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We will also be offering our ever popular two-week (August 4 through August 15), half-day summer camp for students entering grades K through 5. More information will be available in next week's Newsletter.

Students typically experience learning loss over the summer. These camps will help students keep in touch with the Chinese language and expand their learning. I strongly encourage you to take advantage of these wonderful opportunities and to enroll your child in one of the camps. As always, please email me with any questions you may have.


# <u>Until further notice park on the odd numbered side of the</u> street.
