Dear parents,

Greetings from China! I applied for and was accepted as a delegate for the 2012 Chinese Bridge Delegation, scheduled for November 7-15. Since 2006 this opportunity, sponsored by the College Board and Hanban, the Ministry of Education in China, has allowed over 3000 US educators to be immersed in Chinese education. The purpose of the program is to provide school leaders with information and inspiration to start, expand, or enrich Chinese language and culture programs in US schools. I also had the great privilege to attend a similar forum in July 2007. The wealth of information amongst us school leaders is valuable as we share best practices and return to our schools energized to implement new ideas.

From China I will be joining Dr. Lien in Philadelphia at the ACTFL (American Council of Teachers of Foreign Languages) Annual Convention and World Languages Expo from November 16-18. In addition, we have been invited to partake in a pre-conference "think tank" to discuss early immersion with a select group of pioneers seen as trailblazers in this arena.

As our students show what they they've learned through the Endof-Term Exams next week, I am busy learning, too. The "test" for administrators and teachers is to continue to deliver on a topnotch education for our kids and that can only happen when we engage in lifelong learning!

I survived the long flight from Chicago to Beijing and look forward to an early morning wake-up call tomorrow as we hop another flight to Dalian, located between the Bohai and Yellow Seas. We will explore the K-12 schools and universities as well as take in the sights and sounds of this beautiful city.

Luyi's Curriculum Corner

Dear Yinghua Families,

This past week, students and teachers have been diligently preparing for the end of term tests. We all want our students to do well in school and have a successful testing experience and results. There are many things that you as parents can do to help your child prepare for tests at school.

Most importantly, you can communicate to your child that school is important and you believe their job in school is to learn, and that testing is a way to show everyone how well he or she has learned.

Second, parents can be supportive by demonstrating a similar attitude toward the tests as the teachers do. Please communicate with your child that the best way to prepare for tests is to study, know the work, and have good test-taking skills. Therefore, please encourage good study skills and become aware of what your child is studying in school and what his/her assignments are. You can also ask your child to **teach** you the concept she/ he is studying. We know students learn more and demonstrate mastery when they are able to comprehensively teach a subject.

Third, provide a comfortable, well-lit place for your child to study. It also helps if you work with your child and review your child's homework. Study the study packet with them and offer to help quiz your child on facts he/she needs to know. If you notice that your child is having difficulty, ask his or her teacher for advice.

During exam week, please try to plan ahead and keep normal household routines. Please help your child to understand the importance of testing and reassure and encourage your child.

Please also make sure your child gets a good night's sleep and eats a well-balanced breakfast on testing day. Be encouraging and support them to try their best.

We want our students to have a positive attitude toward exams and be proud of their learning. Parents' support is critical for students' success. If you have any questions about the tests, please don't hesitate to contact your child's teacher or me. Thank you for all your support!

NEW TO YINGHUA

Lexia reading and phonics online curriculum

We are excited to share with you information regarding Lexia. This online curriculum is available to all students at Yinghua. This program can be downloaded on your home computers and students can have access daily. On Friday, each student will be receiving a letter with an explanation of the program, downloading instructions and a password.

Lexia will offer our students an opportunity to work on phonics and reading skills at home. Skills are presented systematically and students work through and pass levels. If they come to a level they are having difficulty with, we can provide additional practice to get them through this difficult area. This is an individualized, targeted practice students need to master their reading skills. Yinghua's English teachers will be able to monitor each student's progress online.

Our expectation is that kindergarten and first grade students will all use the program. Since we do not start English till second grade, we feel it is important to provide a consistent model to all our students. We would like all incoming second graders to know all the letters and sounds of letters, be able to discriminate vowel sounds from consonant sounds, and be able to read basic sight words. This program is a perfect way to begin that learning.

Our expectation for second and third graders is that they all use the program as well. Many third grade students need phonics practice, which we continue to work on in classrooms through spelling, but the additional practice in using Lexia will help those who are not quite at a comfortable reading level.

For our fourth and fifth graders we are sending letters home to students via teacher recommendation. Ms. Rademacher will provide a brief explanation on those letters. If your student is in 4th and 5th grade and they receive a letter for Lexia we are strongly suggesting they use the program.

Once a student has confidence in reading, their whole world falls into place. We want our students to learn to read and then read to learn. Please join us in creating this successful reading culture at Yinghua.
