Last week we started learning about Cyber Safety in the 5-8 Grade Discovery classes. In addition to the Discovery sessions, we have also put all grade 5-8 student email accounts on hold so we can do a routine spot-check for safety and adherence to school policies. Dear Yinghua Families,

As I am writing this week's Curriculum Corner, Mrs. Berg should have arrived in Xiamen, China to attend the 9th Global Confucius Institute Conference and represent Yinghua to receive the 2014 Confucius Classroom of the Year Award.

Last week, we were notified by Hanban of this great news. Hanban is the Confucius Institute Headquarters and a public institution affiliated with the Chinese Ministry of Education. Hanban/Confucius Institute is committed to providing Chinese language and cultural teaching resources and services worldwide, meeting the demands of foreign Chinese learners, and contributing to the development of multiculturalism and the building of a harmonious world.

Each year, only 5 schools/institutions around the world will receive the Confucius Classroom of the Year

award. Currently under the 471 Confucius Institutes established in 125 countries and regions, there are a total of 730 Confucius Classrooms. It is a great honor to be selected and receive this award.

The criteria used to select the Classroom of the Year are rigid. Yinghua was given this honor based on our performance in these areas: (1) Number of students enrolled who are learning Chinese; (2) Academic performance and excellent Chinese proficiency of the entire school; (3) Unique curriculum design joining Chinese and western Cultures; (4)

you to know in case your children mention that their school email isn't working. The spot checks should be done in about a week, so this will cause minimal disruption.

In addition, I wanted to send out a very informative parent handout about Cyber Safety. It is from the Center for Safe & Responsible Internet Use and is one of the best summaries about being safe online that I have ever found. Much of what we are talking about in our sessions is also in this handout. I would highly recommend that every parent read through this information. In today's world, it is more important than ever to be well informed about such things. Even if your child is not yet in possession of a cell phone, iPad, or computer, it is only a matter of time before they will be. We want to help all of our parents stay ahead of the curve, which is no small task nowadays! You may not think this information applies to your 3rd grader for example, but in a few short years it will. So, take a look! You will find it worthwhile!

Lastly, we would like to remind parents that all dismissal changes must be submitted by 10:30am on the day of the dismissal. We are getting far too many walk-in and last minute requests after 10:30 for children to be dismissed a few minutes early, be sent to aftercare when they weren't supposed to go that day, be pulled from aftercare when they were originally scheduled for it, ride the bus, not ride the bus, etc., etc. Please understand that we have 660+ students to manage and each one has a custom dismissal plan. For reasons of safety, efficiency, and sanity, we simply cannot accommodate these last minute requests. They must be made by 10:30am. We will no longer adjust your dismissal plans for requests made after 10:30; there are simply too many moving parts. If you arrive towards the end of the day and ask to pull your children last minute, we will have to ask you to wait. The only exceptions are serious emergencies. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation in this matter.



Family Clay Oppurtunity

In the spirit of clay, and the season, I will be offering a drop-in clay studio Saturday, December 6th from 10:00am -2:00pm and Monday, December 8th from 5:00pm-7:00pm. The project will be small scale relief sculpture, perfect for a wall hanging or a personalized ornament. Glazing dates are the following week.

\$10 per project (an artist can purchase multiple projects)

Your \$10 includes:

- A 4 inch by 5 inch flat slab of clay
- · Access to clay tools and art classroom space
- I will take care of firing your pieces when dry in the kiln
- Glazing (glaze is the coating that is often used on ceramic pieces, it has a finished look of shiny paint or glass)
- A second firing, after glazing the sculpture is fired again.

Sculpting studios:

- December 6th 10:00am-2:00pm
- December 8th 5:00pm-7:00pm

Glazing days:

- December 13th 3:00pm-5:00pm (glazing takes less time)
- December 15th 5:00pm-7:00pm

Why to sculpt this season:

Clay is fun, it's cold outside, you can give personalized gifts or make a memento of 2014, you can honor a tradition (bring a favorite family cookie cutter as your template and make keepsakes for everyone), you can drop in for 15 minutes or 2 hours, you can bring all the kids, you can bring no kids, you can bring a friend, you can try something new (or old), you can immortalize your 5 year old's printed name by bringing your 5 year old or a big enough template of their 'signature' to work from, you can purchase one slab per letter in your last name (or address numbers) and make a sign for your house, and you can be creative.

All projects will be glaze-fired and ready for pick up or sent home Thursday December 18th. Please enter school on the Saturday dates at the art room door (Door 16) on the playground side of the school. All children must have an adult present.
