### *Luyi's Curriculum Corner*

Dear Parents,

This morning, we had our Kindergarten Round-up to introduce our incoming Kindergarten students to their new school. We set up activity stations in each Kindergarten classroom and introduced them to their first four Chinese characters: I (我) love (爱) Ying (英) Hua (华). The children each took a picture with Mrs. Berg and me in front of the lion dance prop, and they also had an opportunity to feel what it's like to sit in a school bus. The parents were able to visit different tables and receive information for YACA, After-Care/Enrichment Program, Immersion Summer Camp, and the Health Office.

It was lovely to meet so many young and adorable children. Many of them were reserved and shy in the beginning, but it didn't take them long to warm up and want to participate in the activities. The majority of these children have no previous experience in Chinese, but amazingly I know next year by this time they will have become bilingual and be able to use their Chinese and English proudly. What a wonderful gift we can give to our children!

An incoming Kindergarten parent asked me today how we find Chinese resources for our students. I told her that in addition to purchasing from booksellers all over the country, every time I travel to China, while others browse the souvenir shops, I always visit bookstores and buy as many books and materials as possible to bring back. On last month's MS China Trip, I had all the students help me carry over 100 lbs of books back to Yinghua to support our Book Fair and the classroom libraries. The students were all willing to add a few more pounds to their luggage to make a contribution (in their own way) to support our school. At the Book Fair next week, you will be able to help support Chinese literacy by purchasing the books which the students and I brought back, either for the classroom libraries or for students' home collection. Our students will benefit greatly from reading these age- and developmentally-appropriate Chinese books.

Next week on Monday, our third and fourth grade students will participate in our first Chinese Dictionary Usage Competition in the cafeteria. The purpose of this activity is two-fold: to support students in extending their vocabulary learning and to build their confidence in self-directed learning. We will look for students' speed and accuracy while they look up vocabulary in the dictionary. Certificates will be issued to all participants and to the students who meet the standard level of speed and accuracy respective to their grade. The top three students from each classroom will also receive special recognition.

## PHYSICAL EDUCATION UPDATE

We hope the snow is finished for the season. We will soon begin our training for the trail run (aka "Popsicle Run"). Here is a sample of some of our special spring activities.

**Trash, Treasure or Recycle.** In honor of Earth Day, April 22, we will be cleaning up the park the days before. What will we find, trash or treasure?
