Brewer's Blog

Greetings Parents!

One of the biggest things going on in the school right now are our Chinese New Year preparations. Currently, the staff and many parent volunteers are working hard to put the final plans together for the celebration. If you have visited the school during the day, chances are you have seen students doing kung fu, dancing with streamers, singing songs, working on their dance moves, chanting, yelling, banging on drums, or any number of other fun activities as they practice the shows that they will be performing at the big event on January 31st.

With all of the focus on the Chinese New Year, NWEA Exams, and course work, there isn't a whole lot else to report on right now, other than a quick attendance reminder.

Please remember to always contact the school whenever your child (ren) are going to be absent for any reason. You may do this in three ways:

- A) Phone #612-788-9095
- B) Yinghua Website
 - a. Go to http://www.yinghuaacademy.org/
 - b. Click on "Current Families" tab, then "Report Absence", then fill out the form and submit.
- C) Written Note to the Main Office.

In addition, it is okay to email your child's teacher directly, especially if you are wondering about missed homework. However, notifying your child's teacher does not take the place of notifying the Main Office through one of the three methods listed above. It is vitally important that the office be notified directly for safety reasons and so the school has accurate attendance records. Your child's teachers will notice your child is absent and will record it on the daily attendance sheets, but they do not enter the attendance records themselves. In addition, they are very busy during the day and are not consistently able to forward your emails or phone calls to the office. Moreover, if you only notify your child's teacher, you will usually get an automated phone call or email from the school saying your child is unexcused because the office was not notified as well.

I hope that helps clarify the attendance reporting policy and explains why some of you are still getting the auto call/email even after telling your child's teacher. If you still have attendance questions, please feel free to contact Mary Howard in the Main Office

Luyi's Curriculum Corner

Dear Yinghua Families:

We are off to a great start of 2014. On the academic front, we continue to diligently educate our students and prepare them to become global citizens and face future challenges.

This month, students are taking the NWEA reading and math assessments. The NWEA results will provide a picture as to how students will perform on the Minnesota Comprehension Assessments (MCAs). MCAs, mandated by the Minnesota Department of Education, are administered every spring to students in grades 3 through 8 to measure their performance on the Minnesota Academic Standards in math and reading. Students in grades 5 and 8 will also be assessed in science. These standards define what students should know and do in a particular grade. The testing dates for the NWEA and the MCAs will be announced in the classroom newsletters later in January.

To help students prepare for the MCAs, we have the following plan for this year:

- Add one more English-speaking teacher to the existing morning homework support. This teacher will be available Mondays and Thursdays (from now until the MCAs are done) in the computer lab to answer the questions students may have while reviewing the MCA packets in math, English, or science. (The morning homework support runs from 8:00 AM to 8:30 AM daily in the computer lab and is staffed with both Chinese- and Englishspeaking teachers. Students may bring their work or questions to the computer lab and ask the teachers for help. Please encourage your child to take advantage of this valuable resource.)
- Add a power study session after school from 3:24 PM to 4:10 PM to provide extra support to students whose test-taking skills in English or math need sharpening.
 Teachers will soon contact parents to obtain permission for these students to stay extra time after school for this support.

MIDDLE SCHOOL NEWS







Science

5th grade has been studying the Solar System with a focus on the Earth, Moon, and Sun relationship. Check out the pictured diagram and ask your student to explain it! Students will also learn about the planets in comparison to each other and the tools that astronomers and space explorers use to study the cosmos.

6th grade is using simple machines to explore work and energy transfer. Students created a lever balance to show how force and distance can be manipulated to create mechanical advantage. Inclined planes and pulleys will also be studied. Students will soon be moving on to study harmonic motion and waves in sound and light.

7th and 8th grade used topographical maps to explore landforms and Earth's surface. Students improved their map skills and read about how today's maps are created. They used coordinates of latitude and longitude to find locations on Earth. Next, we will study how Earth has changed over time in the theory of Plate Tectonics.

Social Studies

Grade 6 is concluding its study of the U.S. Dakota War with a project called Avoiding War. Ask your 6th grader how s/he thinks the war could have been avoided!

Grade 7 is engrossed in a library research project. Students are using online library databases to take notes about one of three unusual people involved in World War II -- a Tuskegee Airman, the Women's Army Corps founder, and an internee from one of the Japanese-American internment camps. Ask you student about what s/he is learning!
