Luyi's Curriculum Corner

Dear Parents,

It's been a very busy week for me and for our Middle School students who will be taking the two-week trip to China over spring break. The plane tickets have been purchased and the itineraries have been finalized. We are at the final stage of the trip preparation and will set off on this educational journey on March 10. We will be visiting Beijing, Inner Mongolia, Xian, and of course, our sister school in Hohhot. I am extremely excited that our students will have an opportunity to experience and be immersed in the language and culture they have been learning for so many years.

It has always been our goal to create a true Chinese immersion environment at Yinghua so that every student, without traveling to a Chinese-speaking region, can have a close-to-authentic immersion experience. I have been very lucky to receive guidance from experts in the language immersion field. These experts (researchers, school principals, and consultants) all agree that creating an environment that is close to that of a real native language country is no easy task, and it takes real effort to maintain and protect this environment. To support this goal, they recommend, everything students see, hear, and say should be in the native language; which means that even in the hallways, the bathrooms, and the cafeteria, posters and signs should be in the native language.

At Yinghua we are doing our best to create this environment: Chinese teachers speak only Chinese to the students and provide them with as much vocabulary as possible; hallway prefects use only Chinese to direct students, and signs and posters in Chinese are on the walls. We ask parents to support us by not walking into a Chinese classroom and use English to communicate with the teacher. We appreciate parents' understanding that we are following our mission and doing this for the benefit of our students, and it does take a village to achieve this goal.

During our trip to China, I will witness how our students react in real Chinese environment. My goal for this educational trip is not only to examine our students' language proficiency, but also to gauge their cultural competency. I will share our immersion experience with you when we return from China.

Hello Parents!

Finals are literally right around the corner. They start on Monday! Right after that it's Spring Break! Whoo-hoo!

Speaking of Spring Break, I know that many families will be taking vacations to recuperate before the start of Term III. In fact, there have been many students who have been telling their teachers over the last few days that they will be missing a portion of Finals Week (March 3-7). While we appreciate our students being so responsible in telling their teachers that they will be gone, we've found that in most cases parents have not yet notified The School about the coming absence.

As a reminder, school policy is that parents must notify The School two weeks in advance of planned absences. Unfortunately, we are past that deadline. So, please contact The School immediately if you know that your child(ren) will be missing any school next week. This is not only for attendance record keeping purposes, but also as a courtesy to our teachers. As I'm sure you can imagine, there is a lot going on right now as the term wraps up. Teachers need to know well in advance if their students are going to miss exams so they can coordinate make-ups. Additionally, all make-up exams must be taken before Spring Break. This is to protect the integrity of the exams and also to help your children be successful because their preparation is "fresh".

*In order to accommodate last minute notice before the break, we will also accept emails. If you wish to report an absence for next week via email, send to mary.howard@yinghuaacademy.org and copy your child's teachers and Dr. Lien (luyi.lien@yinghuaacademy.org) so they can start preparations right away. And, don't forget to ask about any make-up work your child may need to do once they return to school.

Also, to further clarify YA Attendance Policies, parents are reminded that family vacations may be "approved" by The School, but will be recorded as "unexcused" in the student's attendance records. This means that you will still get an email/phone call notification from the school's automated system while you are on vacation, even though you notified us. If this happens, please do not be alarmed. Unfortunately, our system cannot distinguish between unexcused absences that have been approved, and those where parents have not notified The School. Please disregard these messages if you know that you have already reported the absence.



Painted by Yinghua 8th Grade Class 2014

This twice masterpiece could be yours! Painted by our 8th graders, it will be auctioned at the Red Lantern Gala TOMORROW! It is 4 feet tall by 3 feet wide, scope out your wall space.

This painting was completed by our Yinghua Academy 8th grade class of 2014 through a collaborative painting process. This detail from Botticelli's masterpiece *Primavera* was chosen for the collaborative project after an extensive unit of study on the Italian Renaissance. Each of our 12 8th graders received a 2" x 2" color copy portion of the original from which to enlarge to their 12"x 12" paper to scale. After drawing their piece in proportion they began to use their knowledge of color theory to match the original colors of Botticelli's work. The 8th grade class was extremely proud of their completed painting.
