Dear Families,

Thank you so much for all your warm wishes and sweet treats! We will certainly enjoy them over the break!

This week we had our first Middle School Chinese Speech Contest. Speaking in front of a group takes courage, particularly when the speech is delivered in a second language; it is even more nerve-racking knowing the judges are listening. We always knew our students had beautiful pronunciation and a rich vocabulary to express their thoughts in Chinese; but we were stunned by their public speaking ability. Witnessing them deliver their speeches confidently and eloquently, we were truly touched. Officiating as one of the judges, Dr. Lien concluded the contest by praising the students for their participation and their language proficiency, and encouraging them to find ways to improve their speaking skills. We will announce the top winners for each grade level after the break.

The students have brought home winter break assignments this week. With respect to precious family time, the teachers have carefully designed the assignments to prepare students for new learning and upcoming statewide testing. It is important that there is time set aside daily for homework during break to avoid last-minute panic. Students in grades K to 3 all have been sent home with a CD which contains Chinese songs, texts, and stories. Please remind your student to listen to the CD every day for 10 minutes to keep in touch with the Chinese language; daily reading in English and in Chinese is also strongly encouraged.

We appreciate all the support our parent community has shown us in 2013. Looking forward to 2014, we will continue to bear the serious responsibility of educating and shaping the young minds, and partnering with parents to foster truly bi-lingual and bi-culture students who are creative thinkers and collaborators with problem solving skills, open-mindedness and world perspective. We will also strive to be the national leader in the field of Chinese language immersion education by seeking improvements in all academic areas, fine-tuning our Chinese curriculum and honing our students' Chinese language skills.

We look forward to a great 2014 and celebrating the Chinese New Year with you.

Winter Break Activities

Try the Minnesota History Center. There is an exhibit about the one amendment to the Constitution which was subsequently cancelled: prohibition. Also, on Friday, December 27, learn about Minnesota's role in the Civil War

at the State Capitol.



Science

5th grade has a focus on Earth Science during Term
2. Students have reviewed the Water Cycle, then connected this to major reserves of Water on Earth and Weather. Students will study the Earth, Moon, and Sun relationship and then the geological processes of Uplift, Weathering, and Erosion.

<u>6th grade</u> has begun Term 2 with a study of Mechanical Energy and Energy Transformations on a Roller coaster. Students will continue to study Energy and Work by constructing Simple Machines and then examine Waves and Harmonic Motion with Springs and Pendulums.

<u>7th and 8th grade</u> completed a Physics review of Matter and Energy and are now continuing with discovering the features of Earth's Oceans. Students are researching and creating presentations about different aspects of the Theory of Plate Tectonics. These concepts will be taught by the students to their classmates upon returning from the Winter Break.

Social Studies

<u>6th grade</u> has now "met" all the groups of people involved in the 1862 U.S. Dakota War. Your son or daughter helped teach the class about one of these groups. Over winter break, s/he will choose a small project: either write a news story based on the experience of one eyewitness account of the war, or view 3 short video clips about the war and create 3 drawings based on what they learned.

<u>7th grade</u> has been studying the period of Reconstruction following the Civil War. They also learned about political cartoons. This week, many students jumped into analyzing political cartoons. One student found a perfect cartoon from 1861 about the Civil War! Another created a cartoon showing Syria's president, and U.S. president Barack Obama's slow reaction to the Syrian crisis.

Over winter break, they will show what they learned by creating a political cartoon. Each cartoon will show (at least) one aspect of African-Americans' dreams of freedom and the problems they faced to realize them. These will be fascinating academic performances!
