Children are eligible for service under IDEA if the disability negatively affects educational performance. If children are eligible for service under IDEA, they are also protected under Section 504 (but the reverse is not true). Under IDEA, children receive an Individualized Education Plan (IEP).

Children with a disability that does <u>not</u> negatively affect educational performance, are not qualified for special education services under IDEA, however, they are usually entitled to protections under Section 504.
