The Effect of Story Reading on Language Acquisition

For our teacher training program this summer, we focused on literacy. I invited an English literacy professor and a Chinese literacy professor to show us ways to "integrate/transfer literacy teaching practice from one language to another" and to "integrate literacy into immersion daily practices." The two professors also discussed the importance of reading aloud to students in order to expand their vocabularies.

Studies continue to confirm that the development of vocabulary and syntactic complexity in language are more advanced in children who are frequently exposed to a variety of sto-

ries. Psycholinguists define reading as an active process based upon this interaction that is creative and predictive. Story reading is also an effective bridge to emergent literacy. Research shows that: "reading stories aloud to children is a significant source of vocabulary acquisition." (Elley, 1989, p. 185)

As our ultimate goal is to cultivate true bi-literacy in Yinghua students, we want to make the best use of the school day to maximize their learning. One important opportunity is our story reading time during morning arrival. Starting around 8:00am selectontinued on page 4

Come to Grandparents' Day!

Every year since our founding, Yinghua has hosted a fall Grandparents' Day celebration. The date is selected to coincide with the Chinese Elders' Day, which occurs on the ninth day of the ninth lunar month. This date is auspicious because in Chinese the word "nine" is a homonym for longevity. In Chinese speaking regions, components of the day typically include drinking chrysanthemum tea and flying kites.

This year's Grandparents' Day at Yinghua falls on Thursday, October 2, and more than 430 grandparents have registered to visit classrooms on this special day. In each of the kindergarten through 4th grade classrooms, one or more parent will offer a presentation. In the past our students have heard presentations about careers, hobbies, travel, pets, and what things were like when our visitors were in elementary school. The day is designed to offer Yinghua students a glimpse of the talents and good work of their elders, and to remind them to show respect for the older generations in our families and in our community.

New this year is an opportunity for middle school students to create a voice recording with a grandparent. We're modeling this on "StoryCorps," an organization that records oral histories and archives them in the Folklife Center at the Library of Congress. You may have heard occasional excerpts from these recordings on National Public Radio's

Morning Edition. While our recordings won't be preserved in the Folklife Center, this opportunity may prompt Yinghua families to make home recordings and preserve inter-generational conversations.

We'll let you know how it goes, and if it works well, we may offer this again next year.

We extend our thanks to the many parents who have signed up to make Grandparents' Day a success. We still have a few volunteer roles to fill, so if you've got an hour or two to spare on October 2, please follow the Grandparents' Day volunteer link on the Yinghua website to sign up.

We are able to use the Jim Lupient Water Park parking lot on October 2! All families must follow their regular dismissal plans for October 2. If you are planning to fly a kite in the park after school, please follow your dismissal plan to retrieve your child first.

New Recreation Building in NE Park

Minneapolis Park Board plans to construct a new recreation building in Northeast Athletic Field Park. The building will be located on the northeast side of the park with access off of Johnson Street. days he or she will ride it. No dismissal plan, no bus. Using Aftercare? The Aftercare registration gets you into our system, but the Dismissal Plan SCHEDULES which days your child will be in Aftercare. No dismissal plan, no Aftercare. Using carpool, curbside, or walking up to pick up your child? You need to schedule this on the Dismissal Plan. Your child walks or bikes? Use the Dismissal Plan to schedule the days. In Soccer, Badminton or Flag Football? Select the Sports option for these days. In music lessons or an enrichment class? Select Aftercare for these days. Same option every day of the month? That's fine, but you still need to fill out a Dismissal Plan every month. (It just takes a few minutes.) Please do it now. The October Dismissal Plan online form is open for you to fill out until 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, September 30. Just ask. Any questions about the Dismissal Plan go to libby.pomroy@yinghuaacademy.org.

tions of English books are read aloud to kindergarten students as they arrive. As the students enter the room, they can easily follow along the story and listen to the native-speaker's inflections. This activity reinforces English vocabulary for those who have English reading practices at home and is a supplementary support for the students who come from non-native-English speaking families. By the time the morning story session ends at 8:30, both the early and late arrival students will have some exposure to English story reading.

We also ask each Chinese homeroom teacher to read aloud to their students in Chinese to help students acquire more Chinese vocabulary. The time spent on story reading at school (in the morning and during class) EVERY DAY is very precious because it (1) enhances students' familiarity with the language they are learning; and (2) adds vocabulary that is important for students' literacy development.

It is also a good idea for students to hear different voices reading aloud to enable them to develop skills to cope with different voices, as is the case in the real world. (McGrath, 2004) To help students develop English literacy skills while they learn Chinese language skills in our full immersion environment at Yinghua, we strongly encourage parents to read English story books to their student every day for one half hour. Please do not underestimate the influence of story reading - your cooperation in reading with your children everyday will make a huge impact in their literary development in both Chinese and English.

Non School Day Camps

Pla-IT: Revolutionary Sports is excited to offer Non School Day Camps for Yinghua families during this 2014-2015 school year, on 24 non-school days and two half-days. All camps will be held at our NEW Indoor Sports Training Facility located at 900 6th Ave SE, Suite 190, 10 blocks directly south of Yinghua.

Each day will include multiple sport and non-sport options, art projects, occasional field trips and more. Every day has half-day and full-day options. Drop-off starts at 7:30 and pick-up before 5:30. Drop-off and pick-up for half-day is between 12-1:00 PM (over lunch). Every day includes three or more structured activities from 9-12 and 1-4. The camp day formally starts at 9AM with an active warmup for all. The remainder of the day will have multiple activities and individuals will be placed in age-appropriate groups.

Your first day-off is October 3rd! Cost is \$35 half-day, \$60 full-day. When you register two weeks or more in advance, the cost is \$30 and \$50 respectively. All individual day registration will be available online by Friday, September 26th. For one week only, you can pay by check to take

advantage of our one-time discounts.
