Dear parents,

Best intentions assumed Emphasis on learning Home school collaboration Examples and evidence Active listening Respect for all Dedication to follow-up

In preparation for conferences, try using "Glow and Grow" a springboard for a conversation with your child/ren. Specifically, ask them in what areas they "glow" or shine, and in what areas they need/would like to "grow". Needless to say, our kids are an important part of this team and they won't be present to represent themselves as we grown-ups meet to review their progress.

Mark your calendars for April 9 and Raising Good Digital Citizens. Dave Eisenmann, Director of Instructional Technology and Media Services will be our speaker. From the looks of his handout, there will be something for everyone. Childcare will be provided!


