Dear Parents of Students Entering Grades 6-8,

I hope you are enjoying your summer! Alas, it will be over all too soon. As you prepare for the start of the new school year, we wanted to remind you of the fall retreat.

This year will mark YA's 4th annual middle school retreat! Retreats are a great way to kick off the school year; the goal being to promote self-discovery, community and friendship across grade levels. It's a great way for students and teachers to connect as classes get underway while also experiencing a wonderful time of adventure, team building, and fun in the great outdoors!

This year we will be going to the *Audubon Center of the North Woods* in Sandstone, MN. The ACNW has a long history of providing top notch environmental education programs for schools. I have been there many times and its one of my favorites! To quote from their website:

Over the last four decades, ACNW has educated over 210,000 K-12, college, graduate, family, Road Scholar, and community participants about the environment and our relationships to it. We do this through formal [we are a certified school — North Central Association Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement (NCA CASI) and field campus to Northland College, Hamline University and other post-secondary schools] and informal education programs, research initiatives, and community outreach that work to restore, maintain, and preserve environmental integrity. The Center uses nature, art, science, history, cultural studies, literature, adventure and team building to give hands-on experiences. ACNW brings people together to learn about our connections to each other and the natural world. Over the last ten years, the Center has committed to an extensive program of renewable energy and has become one of the state's leaders in this significant area.

The staff at ACNW are professionals, trained to work with youth in an outdoor setting. In addition, they are trained in first aid and CPR, and many are certified Wilderness First Responders. While on the retreat the students will stay in a dorm with a YA teacher chaperones and will be under adult supervision at all times.

During the retreat students will spend most of their day outside learning about Minnesota wildlife (including live birds of prey and falconry!), forest and fresh water ecology, and Wilderness Survival. Culturally, students may learn about Ojibwa heritage and the Voyageur Fur Trade, recycling, and sustainable energy. There will also be team building games and challenges, campfires, hiking, and high ropes courses! All classes and activities will be age appropriate and led by ACNW or Yinghua Academy staff member.

Student attendance at the retreat is therefore strongly encouraged. **Parents of students who are absent from the retreat must submit written explanation of the absence to Mrs. Berg & Mr. Brewer two weeks prior to the retreat as this affects billing for the retreat**. Students who do not attend will be expected to come to school all three days and work on independent study projects related to the topics explored during the retreat.
