<b>STAR Reading #1</b> ( Grades 2-8)	Aug. 30 <sup>th</sup> – Sept. 14 <sup>th</sup>	15-20 min
<b>STAR Reading #2</b> ( Grades 2-8)	Oct. 9 <sup>th</sup> – Oct. 16 <sup>th</sup>	15-20 min
<b>STAR Reading #3</b> ( Grades 2-8)	Nov. 26 <sup>th</sup> – Dec. 7 <sup>th</sup>	15-20 min
<b>STAR Reading #4</b> ( Grades 2-8)	March 18 <sup>th</sup> – March 22 <sup>nd</sup>	15-20 min
<p>The Standardized Test for the Assessment of Reading (STAR) is used primarily by English language arts teachers to develop reading goals for the Accelerated Reader program. STAR assessments are also used to monitor growth over the course of the school year. STAR results and AR goals will be distributed to families after the beginning of each term.</p>

Science (Grades 5 &8)	Science April 29 <sup>th</sup> – May 3 <sup>rd</sup>	1.75 hours
<p>The Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments (MCAs) are the state tests in mathematics, reading, and science. They are used to find out how well students can apply the Minnesota Academic Standards. MCA results will be mailed to families prior to fall conferences.</p>

<b>SOPA</b> (Student Oral Proficiency Assessment)	<b>OPI</b> (Oral Proficiency Interview)		
Grades K, 2 & 4	Grades 6 & 8	Winter/Spring 2019 T.B.D.	10 – 15 min
<p>These interactive listening and speaking assessments are designed for children who are learning a foreign language in a school setting. The assessments allow students to demonstrate their highest level of performance in oral fluency, grammar, vocabulary and listening comprehension. Results of the spring assessment will be distributed to families as soon as they are available.</p>			

<b>YCT</b> (Youth Chinese Test)	<b>HSK</b> (Hanyu Shuiping Kaoshi)		
4th Grade & select students	Grades 7 & 8	Spring 2019 T.B.D.	30 - 45 min
<p>The YCT is an international standardized test of Chinese language proficiency that assesses primary and middle school students' abilities to use Chinese language in their daily and academic lives. YCT is divided into writing and speaking tests, which are independent of each other. Results of the spring assessment will be distributed to families as soon as they are available. The HSK is China's only standardized test of Standard Chinese language proficiency for non-native speakers.</p>

<b>Term 1</b> Grades K-8	Nov. 12 <sup>th</sup> – 16 <sup>th</sup>	Varies by grade level
